Granite Snow Sculpture in Town Square

If you are visiting from out of town, be sure to check out the gigantic curling rock that was unveiled in front of the Town Hall this past weekend. The project was handcrafted by master snow sculptor Dean Baker who is well known for his annual front lawn snow creations in Odessa.

Early in the week, with the mild weather and rainy days, there was some concern that the task would not be realized. However, with cooperation from the weather, Town staff and Stephen Roantree's NDSS construction class, the rock landed "on the button" on January 29. The students

helped to build and install the form which was filled with four truck loads of snow by the Town crew. The Bakers shaped the sculpture and topped it off with an authentic looking handle.

Finishing touches with paint gave the rock the look of a real granite curling rock. This project was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and the Downtown BIA.

Team Frans—Thornhill Golf & Country Club

Joe Frans, also known as “The Joe” to his multitude of friends and fans, first broke into the curling circuit in 1991 while curling out of Smiths Falls. Winning the Provincial School Boys Championship and the Provincial Junior Mixed Championship was just the encouragement Frans needed to go on to become the 2002 and 2005 Ontario Men’s Curling Champions. In the 2005 provincial he teamed up with Wayne Middaugh to qualify for the Brier and curled 81%, ranking fourth among seconds.

In his present seventh Tankard appearance, Frans is accompanied by teammates Adam Spencer, Scott Foster, Mike Anderson and alternate John Epping.

When asked about his team’s performance after day one, Frans responded, “We’re doing well, it’s the first day, we’re just getting to know the ice, so splitting one win and one loss is satisfaction for the day.” He also joked, “I can’t wait to play Howard . . . we’re all good friends, but he needs a few losses. He wins too much.” Howard held a 4-0 record at the end of day two, Frans sat at 2-2 after another split yesterday. In last year’s Tankard, Howard’s only loss was a close one, 7 - 6 to Team Frans.

So what is the secret to the success of Team Frans? “Be relaxed, do all our stretching and stay relaxed!” Amanda McKinnon, Loyalist College



Team Gardner—Arnprior Curling Club

Faced with an early bye, Team Gardner was off to a slow start on day one, but rebounded with a win in yesterday’s 2:00 pm draw.

“We had the bye pretty early which was a bit of a disadvantage,” says team skip Chris Gardner. “We like to save the rest until the end of the week.”

Team Gardner, which includes third Brad Kidd, second Mike Aprile, and lead Sean Harrison have been together for over a year and plan to bring an aggressive game to the ice.

“We like to have a lot of rocks in play, so it should be entertaining,” says Gardner. “We definitely want to be a factor.” As promised, in their afternoon game, the team counted 6 in the sixth end against the Bice rink and won 11 to 7.

Their evening game was a loss to Peter Corner’s rink who ended the day with a 3-1 record.

Gardner previously skipped his bantam mixed team to the provincial championships in 2002. His team won the provincial junior mixed title the following year. This is Team Gardner’s second consecutive Ontario Tankard appearance. As the week goes on, the team hopes to execute their strategy and have the rocks slide their way.

“It’s just about who is going to get the right bounce and the right roll at the right time, and at this level that’s what this game is about,” says Gardner. Kelly McKinnon, Loyalist College

Rob Lobel, born June 2, 1966 in Montreal, comes into the 2010 Tankard with nothing but winning on his agenda. After finishing last year’s Tankard in Woodstock with a 4-5 record, his team has been trying to do what’s necessary to win.

“We’ve played over 80 games this year, so it’s all about getting prepared,” said Lobel.

Lobel brings with him the services of brother and third Steve Lobel, second Steve Small and lead Stu Garner. Small played as a junior at the Royal Kingston Curling Club and at Queen’s University. He was also second on Noel

Herron’s rink from Kingston when they competed at the World Junior Championship in 1991.

For Lobel, the highlight of the tournament will happen this morning. “Our TV game is Wednesday at 9 am,” said Lobel. “The game is going to be louder, but we’re used to it.”

With a 5-5 round robin record at the 2008 Tankard, Team Lobel finished fourth, losing the third place game to Mike Harris, 8 to 7. This was an experience that he hopes will help guide the team into the final at the 2010 Tankard. Corey Black, Loyalist College
