Change in Plans for Napanee's Rob Dickson

Local curler Rob Dickson's plans for Tankard week in Napanee changed dramatically on Saturday night when he became a late call-up for Jason Young's rink. Originally scheduled to work as a volunteer, he was selected from the spare list after injuries on the Young team reduced the number of healthy curlers on that team.

Having competed against Dickson's Land O' Lakes rink a number of times, Young's team was familiar with Dickson's play. Dickson's previous experience at three Tankards, two times on the front end with Greg Balsdon's rink, and as skip of his own team in 2008, made him a perfect fit. In that 2008

Tankard, his team was known as "The Spoilers" when they finished the round robin play with two unexpected wins to force two tie breakers. This



week will be a great opportunity for the 32-year-old Dickson to showcase his talents in front of hometown curling enthusiasts as he

competes against the best teams in the province.

Although Dickson had high percentage play as lead with Team Young in their first draw yesterday, they were up against a tough opponent, the defending champion, Glenn Howard. The two teams traded deuces in one of the most exciting games of the afternoon and were tied 6-6 after seven ends. Howard cracked a three in the 8th which helped to ensure his 9 to 7 win in 10 ends.

Dickson did not play in the 7:00 draw last night, but his teammates were successful in securing an 8 to 3 win over the Chris Gardner rink.

Team Bice—Tara Curling Club



All eyes were on the centre sheet in the late ends of the 7:00 draw last night as Mark Bice's rink had Team Howard on the ropes. The Bice team appeared to be in control with a 6 to 5 lead going into the ninth end; however, Glenn Howard's experience reigned supreme as he was able to draw for four. Earlier, in the seventh end, Howard curled his way through several guards to hold the end and keep Bice from scoring two.

The Bice rink is one of the youngest in the field with an average age just over 25 years. Skip Mark Bice is making his second appearance at the Ontario Tankard. His team earned its way to the 2010 Tankard by winning the B-side final at the regional event in Shelburne, after losing a close A-side final to

Peter Corner's team. These same two teams will meet again tomorrow in the 2:00 pm draw.

Third on the Bice squad is Codey Maus, age 24, who also competed on Bice's mixed team which finished as finalists at the Canadian Mixed Curling Championship in November. Although disappointed with the outcome of the game against Howard, Maus was "happy with the way (they) played after struggling with the ice in the first game and not getting a feel for the ice quickly." The team lost a close 8 to 7 decision to Team Frans in the 2:00 draw.

Mark's brother, Steve Bice, is second on this team but has also curled as alternate for Glenn Howard's team throughout the season. Mark Bice, Maus and lead John Grant were all junior provincial champions not so long ago.

Team Cochrane—Rideau Curling Club



Bryan Cochrane's team is off to a great start with two wins yesterday. His first was a 9 to 6 victory over Team Ziola in which he stole the third and sixth ends. He followed that up with an 8 to 6 win against Team Rumfeldt at 7:00 pm. Scoring an early three point end in each game helped his cause.

Cochrane is making his thirteenth appearance at the Tankard and was the champion in 2003. This year, he was defeated by Team Ciasnocha in the

Region 1 A-final, but went on to win the B-final to qualify for the provincials. He is looking for a return to the Brier in Halifax where he skipped in 2003.

Vice Rich Moffatt, now in his third year with Cochrane, skipped his own team to the Brier in 1999. He has also been runner-up in the Canadian Mixed Championship. Playing second is rookie Colin Dow. Lead John Steski has played eight or nine years with Cochrane and has been to the provincials every year except one.

The Ice Hut Lounge

This afternoon's entertainment in the Ice Hut Lounge will feature a young gentleman by the name of Matthew English. Matt is a local musician who has recently completed a university degree in music and education.

Later in the evening, be sure to catch Texas Tuxedo, a successful party

band in the area since their formation in 2007. Ted Lalonde on lead guitar and vocals, John Lalonde Jr. on bass guitar and vocals, and Tommy Vancoughnett on drums and vocals play a diverse mix of new country and classic rock from the 70's to present day.

Club Days at the Tankard

Eastern Ontario has long been a hotbed of curling. In close proximity to Napanee are numerous curling clubs with a long history of good curling and good camaraderie. One of the goals of the 2010 Ontario Tankard Host Committee is to promote the sport of curling and to highlight the clubs of our region. Each day of the Tankard will highlight some of our curling club neighbours. Be sure to visit their displays located near the Ice Hut Lounge.

Did you know?

- The earliest indication of the beginning of curling was 1511, the date found carved on a curling stone in Scotland.
- Canada was the only country ever to use iron curling stones which were first made in 1760.
- The first curling club in Ontario was formed in Kingston in 1820.
- The first indoor curling rink with artificial ice opened in 1907 in Scotland.
- The first Ontario Tankard was played in 1927.
- In 1928, the Brier reduced its length of game from 14 ends to 12.
- Canada has more curlers in total than any other country. Approximately 80% of the world's curlers are Canadian.
- The average lifespan of a curling rock is 50 years.
- Curling stones are made of a unique type of granite which is mined exclusively in Scotland and, more recently, Wales.
- Canada has won six Olympic medals in curling: two in 1998, two in 2002 and two in 2006.
- In Canada, every year, approximately 7000 curlers enter the play-downs that lead to the Brier.

The Quinte Curling Club

Incorporated in April 15, 1957, the official opening of the Club located at the Belleville Fairgrounds was February 15, 1958. It had a membership of 374. Sixty-four new stones purchased for the Club were shipped from the Isle of Craig, Scotland, costing a total of \$2080. Because so many of the original members were new curlers, the famous Garnet Campbell of Saskatchewan was brought in to give three days of instruction in November 1958.



In its 53rd year, the QCC has great member-volunteer participation, excellent curling ice and a well balanced mix of youth, adult and senior members. The club offers a healthy, active and social environment for all levels of play.

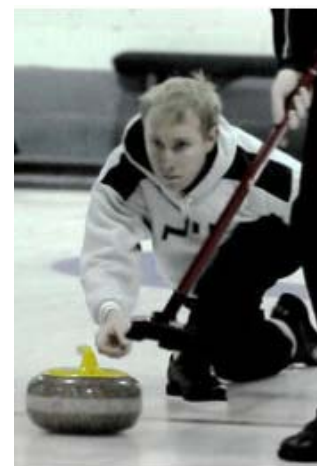
Team Ciasnocha—Trenton Curling Club
